Levochka, I, thank G-d, am learning to walk. The first time I stood on my feet, I would have fallen if the nurse had not grasped me. But I hope to feel better soon.

My dear, you cannot even imagine how happy I am, that I am coming home. I hate the hospital. I am dreaming about the time when we'll be together at home. And as soon as you are ready, come and pick me up.
